

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

ID Registration

Registration in AUnica (Politecnico Database) is mandatory if you want to use the Politecnico online services.

To register as a new user, **go to the <u>Polimi website</u>**. Then, **select "Access online services"** on the top right of the page, and when a new page opens – if it is in Italian, select "EN" at the top right of the page – select the option "Register" and follow the procedure, completing the **registration form.** Insert the information as written on your passport / identity document (all given names and surnames, for example).

Your **Personal Code** and the related **password** are your credentials to access all the Politecnico Online Services: memorize or take note of them and send your "person code" to the office responsible for your visit*.

Identification

When you arrive at the Politecnico di Milano, **go to the office** responsible for your visit*. Take **your passport and/or identity card with you**, so that we can complete the identification procedure in our online system.

Safety course

To access DEIB, visitors who are staying for more than five working days must attend and pass our online safety course. Visitors who are staying for less than five working days can choose not to follow the course, but they will not receive the temporary card which gives access to the Department spaces and they will always have to be accompanied by some member of the Department. Go to the <u>Polimi website</u> and access the Online Services with your Personal Code and password. Search for "Data" and, then, select "**Training courses**" (or search directly for "Training courses" in the search bar).

When a new page opens, select "Courses on Safety". Select "Basic Course on Safety" if you are staying for more than two weeks (it's the first course you see), or "Managing Emergencies" if you are staying for a shorter period (it's the fifth course you see).

Guest temporary card

After having completed the identification procedure, if you have followed the course on safety, we will introduce you to the person in charge of the Access Office who will give you a guest card which gives you access to the areas of the Department you are authorized to enter.

At the end of your visit, **return the guest card** to the reception desk.

Spaces

During the first week of your stay here, your academic host and the Secretary staff member will give you information related to the spaces dedicated to your activities and will show you the places in which you can conduct your research.

WIFI

When you are on a Politecnico Campus, or in a Politecnico Residence, you can use the Polimi Wi-Fi with your personal code and password. Further details on the two-factor authentication are available here. If you have difficulties, contact support-deib@polimi.it: the ICT Office of the Department can give you any technical support you might need.

Non EU Citizens

Non-EU citizens coming to Italy for more than 90 days must submit the application to obtain a **residence permit within eight days from their arrival**. We can help you to fill in the form in the KIT: contact the office responsible for your visit* to make an appointment.

Phone Services

Bank Account

In order to open a bank account, you need a copy of your passport, or another document of identification, and an Italian tax code (codice fiscale). Politecnico di Milano has an ongoing agreement with the Banca Popolare di Sondrio. You can find a bank office at Campus Leonardo, building 2 (Edoardo Bonardi, 4).

Health Insurance

If you do not have a private health insurance policy that is valid in Italy, contact the office responsible for your visit*.
